

ARE YOU DISASTER READY?

Our fire season has become a year-long concern. Earthquakes are guaranteed events. Neighboring manufacturing and transportation facilities may pose risks. During the initial phases of any disaster first responders will likely be overwhelmed and unable to attend to all affected areas and persons. CERT training offers a realistic approach to prepare and respond to emergency situations.

You are invited to take the full basic training course, only the classes that are important to you, or attend one of the single-topic 2-hour classes held in the summer months. All training has been developed according to national guidance and principles outlined by the Homeland Security Program.

FREE BASIC TRAINING - Spring 2025

The instructor-led course consists of 8 classes on topics such as Personal and Family Preparedness, Earthquake Preparation, Team Organization, Medical Operations and Triage, Damage Assessment, Fire Suppression, Utility Control, and Light Search & Rescue. To practice these new skill or as a refresher, we conclude with exercise drills. We also offer a supplemental exercise to practice field-work radio skills.
